Newcomb-Tulane College is pleased to announce its appointment of Dr. Eva Silvestre as interim Associate Dean and Director of the Center for Academic Equity. Her term will be from January 1 to June 30, 2020. In addition, Dr. Silvestre serves as the team lead for Tulane at MEASURE Evaluation and Data 4 Impact, which is a USAID funded program that works in low-resource settings to build the capacity of local organizations to use routine data to evaluate health programs.
