#### MESSAGE FROM THE ASSOCIATE DEAN- M.A. "Tonette" Knousel-Wood, MD, MSPH



Tulane MD/MPH 2024 Graduates finished their combined medical and public health training in style! As the first cohort to enroll in the SOM during the COVID-19 Pandemic, it was a special time for in-person ceremonies and celebration as many did not have formal college graduation experiences due to COVID-19 restrictions. We 'toasted' our 2024 graduates at the first (and hereafter annual) Tulane MD/MPH Graduation Social It was a perfect way to reflect on our graduates accomplishments through their training, community outreach, and scholarship and their pathway forward as future physicians and medical leaders.

Entering into the Tulane MD/MPH Program's 53rd year with over 1300 graduates to date, there is continued high interest in the combined degree program with an increase in number of enrollees over prior years. With nearly 150 students (T1-T4) currently enrolled (53% women, 29% non-white), the program remains committed to advancing equitable clinical and public health practice with a highly trained and diverse workforce equipped with the skills to practice at the interface of medicine and public. Our students' demonstrated commitment to the integration of social and behavioral disparities and access to healthcare, chronic disease risk throughout the life course, advances in cancer treatment and international public health issues have led to an impressive number of scholarly works, grant funding, awards and honors. Importantly, our students are dedicated to improving health in underserved and underrepresented communities by learning and supporting efforts at the Violence Prevention Institute, Ozanam Inn, Formerly Incarcerated Transitions Clinic, Luke's House Clinic. Louisiana Department of Health, DePaul Community Health Centers, Crescent Care, Children's Hospital Parenting Center, Center for Transgender and Gender Expansive Health, US Department VSFS Program, The Naloxone Project and Bwindi Community and Hospital Buhoma in Uganda. Many thanks to our mentors, advisors, and program support (Dr. DalCorso, Rachael Currier and Taylor Schwab) for their ongoing support.

Further, the MD/MPH Class of 2024 matched in excellent residency programs in 17 different states and 11 different specialties (15 in primary care and 21 in sub-specialties). Additionally, our National Institutes of Health-funded TL1 Pre-doctoral Research Training Program in partnership with the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) Center for Clinical and Translational Science (CCTS) has successfully trained a total of 25 Tulane pre-doctoral students (over 3 funding cycles) in translational research in a year-long mentored research program designed to prepare translational thinkers to address acute and chronic conditions affecting the Gulf South and related health disparities. Many of our students gave poster and oral presentations at the Southern Society for Clinical Investigation's Southern Regional Meeting and the National ACTS Advancing Clinical and Translational Science Meeting to present their research. Many thanks to our donors who provide funding for scholarships and for student travel to attend professional meetings! Through these opportunities, our students learn how to practice at the interface of medicine and public health to improve health of individuals and communities. This edition of the newsletter highlights some of the achievements of the MD/MPH Class of 2024 and recognizes our current MD/MPH students and recent graduates who received research scholarships and awards. 
