# 2020 SPHTM Student Funding

## What are the different types of student funding covered in this guide?



### **Funding Umbrella #1 Scholarships/Awards**

Scholarships are sponsored monies given to students to be applied toward tuition/fees. Awards are monies given to students who meet certain criteria but not specifically bound to tuition/fees.



### **Funding Umbrella #2 Internship Funding**

Internship funding often comes in the form of sponsored grants or stipends to cover the duration of an internship, housing, travel, etc. These could also simply be paid internships.



### **Funding Umbrella #3 Research/Conferences**

Monies are given to students to help fund independent or faculty mentored research and/or conference travel. These often come in the form of grants.

<b>National Center for Health Research</b>	<u>Fellowships, Internships, and Funding for undergraduate and graduate students</u>	Fellowships offered to PhD and MPH students, while internships are available to both undergraduate and graduate student public health populations.
<b>National Institute of Health</b>	<u>Grants, Funding, and Loan Repayment Programs for Health Professionals</u>	The LRPs counteract financial pressure by repaying up to \$35,000 annually of a researcher's debt in return for NIH mission commitment.
<b>Phrma Foundation</b>	<u>Research Starter Grants, Awards, and Pre &amp; Post-Doctoral Fellowships</u>	PhRMA Foundation awards are offered in a variety of disciplines including health outcomes, informatics, toxicology, etc.
<b>Robert Wood Johnson Foundation</b>	<u>Grant Programs for Funded Research</u>	\$50,000 - \$300,000 for up to 3 years (research that yields convincing findings regarding population health, well-being, and equity).
<b>Rotary Foundation</b>	<u>Global Grants</u>	The Rotary Foundation has funded graduate level academic studies and vocational training teams abroad (includes water and sanitation, education projects, disease prevention and treatment).

<b>State of Louisiana/Board of Regents Support Fund</b>	<u>Grant opportunities and campus funding</u>	The BoRSF affords grant opportunities for four constitutionally designated activities designed to improve educational quality, foster Louisiana’s research, and contribute to the State’s economic development.
