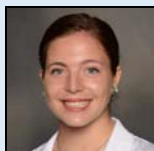
The 2017-2018 year has been a banner year for the MD/MPH Program and Public Health and Medical Education! From receiving scholarships for research opportunities in cardiovascular and genetic diseases, being selected for awards for environmental health research and tropical medicine, dedicating effort to primary healthcare in the community to being chosen for Fulbright Global Health fellowships and NIH –funded pre-doctoral research training in translational research, our students have been actively integrating public health scholarship with their medical training.

This year, we initiated the inaugural **MD/MPH Distinguished Alumni Lecture program** which gave us the opportunity to invite one of our program alumni who is utilizing her combined degree training to tackle one of our most pressing healthcare challenges in the US and beyond. In April, MD/MPH Class of 1998 alumna and Director of the CDC’s National Center for Injury Prevention and Control, Dr. Debra Houry, presented the 2018 MD/MPH Distinguished Alumni lecture on *Addressing the Opioid Epidemic*, the response to which she is leading at the CDC. Attendees included students, faculty and staff across Tulane University and nearby universities who are on the front lines of this epidemic and are seeking insights into CDC programs to foster success. Dr. Houry also took the time to network with our MD/MPH students in a small group session prior to her lecture, when she shared how her public health and medical training provided the foundation to achieving her long-term career goals.

The **MD/MPH Class of 2018** is continuing medical training, having matched in well-respected residency programs at Tulane and across the US, representing 14 states and 14 specialties, including primary care, psychiatry and surgical subspecialties. In addition, 15 graduates collectively received 25 awards for their achievements in public health and medicine. Congratulations Class of 2018!

In this role, she leads innovative research and science-based programs to prevent injuries and violence and to reduce their consequences. Dr. Houry is a 1998 MD/MPH graduate of the Tulane School of Medicine and School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine. Her MD/MPH Program Distinguished Alumni lecture, “Addressing the Opioid Epidemic: Providers on the Frontlines of Medicine and Public Health,” delivered on April 20, 2018, reflected her experiences leveraging her combined degree training at Tulane in her career and helping lead the CDC’s response to the opioid crisis.

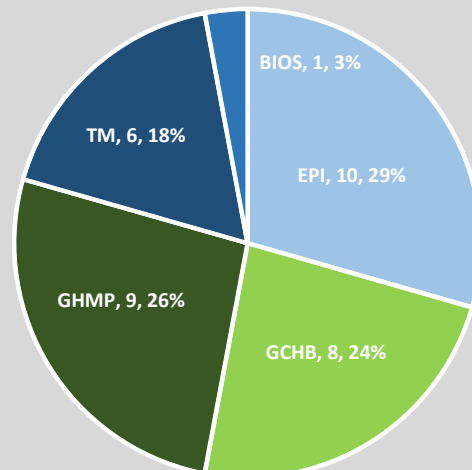

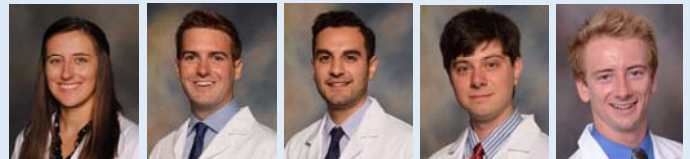
